## Rally Day is on Sunday, September 8th!

We go return to our fall worship schedule and our Christian education classes for all ages begin on Sunday, September 8. The traditional worship service will be at 8:00 a.m. and the Celebration service at 10:30 a.m. Christian education classes meet at 9:15 a.m. Pastor Paul’s sermons on Rally Day is “Big Decisions and Serious Business” as he talks about the importance of giving God total and complete faithfulness.

Making the effort to regularly worship our God and hear God’s holy word are key parts of this faithfulness. Let’s all get the fall off to a good start by faithfully participating in these important aspects of Christian discipleship.

## Can You Help Fund “Rise Against Hunger”?



Our biggest activity for “God’s Work Our Hands” on Sunday, September 15, is the food packaging program sponsored through the Christian aid organization, “Rise Against Hunger”. Our goal is to package 10,000 meals at church that afternoon.

We took one of those “leaps of faith” in doing this. Grace is paying 3.4 cents for each meal we package as well as travel expenses for the staff of “Rise

Against Hunger” who will lead the event. The total cost is over \$3,700.

While we have set aside some money from our gifts and memorials accounts and youth funds to cover some of this expense, and those who are working are encouraged to donate \$10.00 per person, we still need more money to fully cover the cost of this event. If you can make a donation of any size, it would be greatly appre-

ciated. Checks can be made out to “Grace Lutheran” with a memo that it is for “Rise Against Hunger”. Thank You!

## “Believe in Grace” – Our Fall Stewardship Program in October

We have both great challenges and opportunities ahead of us, as a congregation, as we look to our personal giving for 2020. While our congregational giving has increased by \$100,000 since 2015, we are still not fully supporting our much larger church mortgage. The congregation voted to approve a 2019 budget with a \$40,000 deficit. This deficit is being funded by the money in our contingency fund.

Our goal for 2020 is to eliminate most, if not all, of that

deficit and bring us back to a balanced budget. To do this we are focusing on our theme, “Believe in Grace”. As Christians, we are called to believe in God’s grace that is given to us through Jesus Christ. As members of this church, we are also called to believe in Grace Lutheran and do all we can to support the work of Christ done in and through our church home.

You will begin to receive information about our “Believe in Grace” program later in

September. Our three Sundays dedicated to the importance of supporting the work of the church will be October 6, 13 and 20.

Please start to consider your gifts to the work of the church for 2020 and make the commitment to increase your giving in a meaningful and significant way.



## Confirmation Classes Begin on September 11

We are set to begin our fall confirmation classes. Wednesday evening classes for our seventh graders, who are studying the Old Testament, and our eighth graders, who will cover the New Testament, begin on Wednesday, September 11.

The ninth graders will begin their final year of confirmation on Sunday afternoon, September 22 when they meet with their parents and me to discuss the important Affirmation of Baptism promises they will make next May.

I like to think that we have a good confirmation program at Grace. Our young people spend a lot of time studying the Bible and learning the Ten Commandments. We also study Luther’s “Small Catechism” and get good practice in serving others. The parents of our students attend several of our classes each year.

Students attend Confirmation Camp at the end of seventh grade and there is a winter retreat for our ninth graders.

We’re doing something new this fall by holding a Junior

Youth Group retreat for our sixth – eighth graders at Lutherdale Bible Camp on October 18-19. It’s open to all our kids and we’ll focus on living as disciples of Jesus Christ.

They also get to participate in our Junior Youth Group activities in seventh and eighth grade and our high school HYPE group in ninth grade.

Please keep our young people in your prayers that they will grow in their faith as they learn to live out the promises their parents made for them when they were baptized.

## Meg Is Preaching on September 26 and 29

We are happy to welcome Meg Boren as she shares God’s word with us in worship. Meg is going to preach at the Thursday evening worship service on September 23 and at both services on Sunday, September 29. She will also lead the Adult Forum on Sunday. Meg always does a great job of

## Have You Signed Up for the Scrip Program?

There is an easy way to help Grace earn money – please tell me more!! Grace has recently joined the Scrip program. The Scrip program? What is that? And how will it help Grace?

When you sign up for the Scrip program and shop as you normally shop at participating stores, you can help give hundreds of dollars each year to Grace. It is that simple!

### How do you sign up?

Well it is easy, just go to [www.shopwithscrip.com](http://www.shopwithscrip.com) and sign up. You will need to use our organization code (LECAL22F63645). You can also do it on the Scrip app on your phone.

### How does it work?

- After you sign up, you go onto the Scrip app on your phone or log into your scrip account on your computer, look at the ALL of the stores that participate.
- Once you find the stores

you shop at you can order a gift card.

- Gift cards come in two forms: Physical gift card or E-gift card. Choose what kind you would like to have & place your order.
- If you choose an physical gift card, you need to place your order (on your scrip site) by the 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 p.m.
- They will be delivered to church & can be picked up later that week. E-gift cards will come directly to your Scrip wallet on your app & usually are available to use that same day.

### How do you pay?

There are two ways to pay for your Scrip orders. You can write a check to Grace Lutheran Church (put your check in Chantal Murack's church mailbox) or you can sign up to use PrestoPay (Scrip's online payment). You just choose your payment type when you check out.

### How does it help Grace?

Every time you purchase a gift card or e-gift card a percentage of the purchase goes to Grace. So if you shop at Pickn' Save buy a Roundy's gift card. Roundy's has a 4% donation. So if you buy a \$100 gift card that means Grace earns \$4.00! Can you imagine if everyone at church joined how much money we could earn just by shopping!!

## Caring for Creation

What wonders of creation did you enjoy this week? You have most likely noticed that the young Sandhill cranes are as big as their parents these days. The only way one can tell them apart is by looking at them through binoculars or by photographing them, downloading the images to your computer, then enlarging the images and looking closely at the heads. If there is white and red around the eye, it is, most likely, an adult. If, however, the color around the eye is brownish it is, probably, this year's young. That may not be the best or surest or fastest way, but it is what I do. It appears, that most couples have had only one chick survive. That is not uncommon – two are born but only one, normally, survives.

On a recent trip west and north then back east while staying north, God showed us fawns, still with spots, but they are fading; and He colored the countryside with a wide variety of yellows - several species of goldenrod, woodland sunflowers, fields of commercially grown big, tall sunflowers, Compass-plants, Grey-headed cone-flowers, and Common St. Johnswort – to name a few. These were accented with patches of purples here and there - Wild bergamot, Purple loosestrife, and asters. All are commonly seen, but we were surprised at the amount of the Purple loosestrife (photo) that was taking over many of the ditches (they are alien). We were under the impression that the state, had found a small critter, bug, that ate them and kept them under control. Maybe that's

wrong. Best that is checked out (which I did). According to the WDNR, "Galerucella beetles have been successful in many parts of the state in controlling Purple loosestrife populations." (Maybe they just did not get to those we saw.) How do you know how to identify the loosestrife? The Purple loosestrife is a wetland perennial, 3'-7' tall, with up to 50 stems topped with purple flower spikes. The DNR describes them as having: "Leaves: simple, lance-shaped and do not have petioles (stalks connecting the leaves to the stems). Usually opposite and rotated 90 degrees from those below, but are sometimes whorled." The flowers are attached close to the stem and bloom from late June to September. Loosestrife grows in damp ditches and wetlands, where they then squeeze out the cattails. They have fruits, which have seeds which are capsulated and can burst open anywhere from July through October. "A single stem can produce 100,000-300,000 seeds per year. Mature plants with many stems can produce 2 million seeds. Seeds are viable for at least 7 years." (Again, per the DNR.) If you are so inclined, in addition to the state introducing the "bugs," these plants can be removed by digging or can be pulled. Mowing is not recommended because any of the plant parts may re-sprout and seeds may be dispersed. You could use chemicals - Imazapyr or glyphosate. They work well, but if you use any of them near water, a permit may be required and aquatic-use formulas of these herbicides should be used. To get more involved with the bio-

control of this "weed," go to the DNR web site. Type in the Purple loosestrife biocontrol page and read. (That would be a good project to get involved with.) To find this plant, look for it in moist places and/or shallow waters, where one or two is/are enough to compete with the native plants, spreading and growing so tight that no other wildflowers or wildlife will be able to live among them. It is very versatile, adjusting to varying light conditions and/or water levels. The plant is still being sold as an ornamental accent where the commercial flowers are yellow. If so used, that is when the seeds might escape and a new colony might be born. Enough! (Probably more than enough.)
